At that time, I didn't fully understand and appreciate the special place this was and certainly I did not know how this place and the people who pass through this place would profoundly impact me over the next many years. I inherited the legacy that the former staff and students left—a belief of “leaving things a bit better than you found them”. I mean that in regard to our interactions with people and with place. Let me share with you what I have experienced.
