ADST Grade 6-9

Applied Design Skills and Technology

French Immersion Grade 6-8

Open to non-francophone students who have already completed a minimum of one year of middle years French Immersion. This course builds upon the French foundational skills developed in both Early French Immersion and Late French Immersion Grade 6 and 7.

Entrepreneurship & Marketing 10

In a world filled with influencers, targeted ads, and constant media messaging, it's more important than ever for students to understand how marketing really works. Entrepreneurship & Marketing 10 helps students become smart, informed consumers while introducing them to the exciting world of business.

Through real-world examples—like influencer culture, public relations, viral marketing, and even the rise of creators such as Mr. Beast—students learn how companies capture attention, shape trends, and sell products. This course empowers students to think critically, understand the strategies behind what they see online, and explore their own creative ideas for branding and advertising.

Jewellery Making 10

This hands-on Summer Learning course is an introduction to the fundamentals of jewellery making and metal art. You'll learn how to safely use core hand tools (jeweller's saw, pliers, files, mandrels, hammers, and basic finishing tools) to cut, shape, bend, texture, and connect metal and wire into wearable pieces like rings, pendants, bracelets, and small wire forms. Projects are designed to build confidence, patience, and craftsmanship while giving you plenty of room to personalize your work through the design cycle (plan → create → test → improve). No prior experience is needed, just a willingness to try, learn, and create.

Returning students are welcome too. If you've taken jewellery making or art metal before, you'll have the freedom to build on your existing skills, create more complex projects, and push your designs further.

Attendance
